You will also need access to the Zoom application, so that you may attend discussions and office hours.

## **WHAT ABOUT GRADES?**

Your final grade will be calculated from your scores on four lecture exams and three lab exams. Your lecture exam scores are 70 percent of your grade, while the lab exam scores are worth 30 percent. All exams will be released on Blackboard and you will have a 24-hour window to complete the exam. After the window is closed, there will not be an opportunity to make up the exam.
