#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE**

Introduces the fundamental elements of Spanish sentence structure and vocabulary. Promotes speaking, listening, reading and writing skills within a cultural context. Class work may be supplemented with required aural/oral practice outside of class. Your ability to understand and communicate will develop along with your knowledge of the rich culture in the Spanish-speaking world, including the Hispanic/Latino communities in the U.S. This course fulfills one semester of the Foreign Language requirement as needed for Associate Degree plans and transfer credit to four-year institutions. Note: Students who are majoring in Programs in the College of Arts & Sciences at Texas Tech University (our primary transfer institution) are required to successfully complete SPAN2311 and 2312-Intermediate Spanish I and II (followed by the completion of SPAN1411 and 1412) as part of the graduation requirement. The number of courses required varies from discipline and institution. There are no pre-requisites for this course.

#### **COURSE ASSESSMENTS**

Because of the nature of this course (learning a foreign language), it is important that students receive regular feedback on their progress. Weekly participation and assignments are required to ensure students are pacing and progressing successfully.

### Participation: (20%)

These are graded and ungraded assessments; however, it is required and will count towards participation in this course as long as you complete these activities in class or turn them in before their due dates. No make-up work allowed.

- During the first week of class students will take a pre-test assessment based on the content of this course to check your knowledge of this course. Weekly assessments will follow.
- After you watch the "Spanish Tutorials" by chapter and after reading each chapter in "eText" via MSL, take the vocabulary and grammar self-check assessments in class. These are helpful in providing you with an understanding of what areas you need to focus in preparation for chapter exams and oral presentations. While not graded, they will count towards participation in this course.
- In-class group projects require your research, participation, collaboration and presentation on assigned topics. Detailed information will be provided in class at a later date.

### **Homework Assignments: (20%)**

In order to master this course, students are required to view chapter tutorials, and consistently complete homework assignments via MSL. It is recommended that students do homework daily when possible, but at least three times a week. Please see "MSL" section below for instructions on registering as a new/returned student and for additional detail and information.

- Assigned homework is a combination of auto-graded and instructor graded material via MSL. They are designed to help you practice speaking, writing, listening and reading skills in Spanish. Please go to MSL's assignment tab or you can see blue alarm clocks on your MSL today's view. Once the alarm clock turns red , it means your assignment is "past due". You are still allowed to work on these for practice; however, the grades will be recorded as zero "0".
- All MSL weekly homework assignments are due on a Sunday at 11:59pm central standard time. You will have 3 attempts per each exercise. Your grade will be recorded with the highest attempt. You may choose to complete future assignments ahead of time; however, no late assignments will be accepted.
- Homework grades are available for auto-graded material immediately and the full chapter grade for homework will be available after each chapter exam and can be accessed through blackboard.

IMPORTANT: MSL Voice Recording Homework, which requires you to record your voice, must be done without surrounding noise such as music or other people speaking in the background. In addition, if your recording indicates that someone helped you with an assignment or if you record vulgar language, you will receive a grade of zero (0) and disciplinary actions will be initiated for academic dishonesty and/or misconduct on your part.

#### Chapter Exams (30%)

There will be 4 Chapter Exams. (The lowest exam grade will be dropped). The exam will focus primarily on the content of the chapter; however, since language learning is cumulative (similar to math classes), they are comprehensive (include material from previous chapters which you are responsible for retaining and reviewing) and mandatory and will test reading, writing, culture, listening skills and your ability to use grammar and vocabulary in communicative situations. Each exam is timed (you have one hour to complete it). See Course Calendar for exam dates. A review/study guide will be provided before each exam. See make-up policy.

### Oral Exams (30%)

There will be 2 oral exams (one midterm and one final). Specific instructions will be provided, and the topic will be based on content covered in your textbook. You will be graded on grammatical competence and accuracy, content and vocabulary, fluency and pronunciation, and effort to communicate in Spanish. A rubric will be available before the oral exams if you request to see it. Otherwise, it will be provided after your exam along with your grade. See make-up policy.

Respondus LockDown Browser for chapter exams are enforced in this course. WARNING: You are NOT allowed to use any notes, your book, or any other materials or resources while taking exams.

Important! Technical issues are not an excuse for late work. You may complete your assignments, and assessments as early as they become available to ensure prompt submissions or to avoid any unforeseen circumstances.

#### ATTENDANCE POLICY

- Students are expected to attend all classes in order to be successful, especially in a foreign language class. The student will be administratively withdrawn from this course when absences become excessive. For this class, five absences will warrant you an administrative withdrawal with an F or X without further warning. Students who enroll in a course but have never attended by the official census date, will be administratively dropped by the Office of Admissions and Records. It is your responsibility to be aware of this policy especially if you receive financial aid. Please contact them for questions.
- Students are expected to be on time and to remain the entire class period. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each class period. If you leave class early, or arrive late, you may not receive credit for an assessment, activity, exam, participation, or any work collected that day. Missing class the day before will not be accepted as an excuse for not being prepared when you return.
- The last day to drop a course and receive "W" is April 23, 2020. Per state law, students enrolling for the first time in Fall 2007 or later at any Texas college or university may not withdraw from more than 6 courses during their undergraduate college career. Some exemptions may apply.

- Completion of vocabulary, pronunciation, culture, and grammar practice activities listening speaking, fill-in-the-blank with/without options, matching words, open-ended, word and sentence creation, etc. (Graded)
- Short vocabulary and grammar self-check assessments. (For credit/Graded)

### Four chapter exams:

- One at the end of each chapter. (Graded)
- Note: all written works require to be typed with proper marks (accents, questions and exclamation points) and formatted and cited according to the MLA style.

#### Oral exams:

 2 comprehensive oral exams (one midterm and one final) which consist of questions, situations and discussions from chapters studied. Specific information will be provided. (Graded)
