**IMPORTANT:** In order to master this course, students are required to be self-disciplined, to possess computer skills and good reading and writing skills, to be willing to log on at least three times a week for messages and assignments, to complete assignments ahead of schedule, to meet deadlines, to spend long periods of time at a computer, and if health situation arises, to work independently by learning materials on their own using chapter tutorials, studying the eText, viewing video lectures, and downloading additional class notes via MySpanishLab (MSL) and Blackboard (BB).

**Course Description:** The consolidation of skills acquired at the introductory level. Further development of proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Emphasis on comprehension, appreciation, and interpretation of cultures of the Spanish-speaking world. Semester Hours: 3 Lecture Hours: 3 Lab Hours: 2 Pre-requisite: Beginning Spanish II (SPAN 1412).

## Homework Assignments: (15%) MSL (https://mlm.pearson.com)

In order to master this FLEX course, students are required to learn materials on their own by viewing chapter tutorials, studying the eText, watch video lectures and consistently complete homework assignments via MSL. Additional class notes can be found on BB. It is recommended that students do homework daily when possible, but at least three times a week. You will be given a significant number ofassignments in order to provide the practice that you would otherwise have in a face to face class.

- MSL homework assignment is a combination of auto-graded and instructor graded material. They are designed to help you practice speaking, writing, listening and reading skills in Spanish. Click onMSL's "Today's View", go to Assignment tab (To do) or simply click on the blue clocks seen on your MSL "Today's view" Calendar. When the clock turns red , it means your assignment is "past due". You are still allowed to work on these for practice; however, the grades will be recordedas zero "0". No late assignments will be accepted. See Make-Up Policy.
- All MSL weekly homework assignments are due on a Sunday at 11:59pm central standard time. You will have 3 attempts per each exercise. Your grade will be recorded with the highest attemptedscore. You may choose to complete future assignments ahead of time since the entire semester's MSL weekly Homework assignments will be posted on the first day of class; however, please remember this is NOT a self-paced course; therefore, please adhere to the course Schedule and Deadlines (on BB) for a positive and successful outcome in this class.
- Homework grades are available for auto-graded material immediately.
- Note: Spelling, accent marks, punctuation marks, capitalization, grammar and pronunciation are extremely important and will have a negative impact on your grade if used incorrectly.

<u>Quizzes</u>: (10%) Quizzes are timed and will cover materials presented and studied in this course: grammar,vocabulary, pronunciation, conversation, reading, listening comprehension, and content from Blackboard and your course syllabus. You will use MSL to access and complete them. The deadlines for the quizzes are found in the "Schedule & Deadlines", and "My Grades" widget on Blackboard. See Make-up Policy. All quizzes are due at the end of the day on Wednesdays, central standard time.

- Go to MSL website, open your course, go to Today's View's Calendar, click on the due dates (seeSchedule and Deadlines on BB), which contain an alarm clock with notes provided, or go to Assignments tab, To do, you will see the quizzes on the list. Click it. Open it. Complete it.
- You must adhere to the Honor Pledge stated in your syllabus.
- Note: Spelling, accent marks, punctuation marks, capitalization, grammar and pronunciation are extremely important and will have a negative impact on your grade if used incorrectly.

**MSL Voice Recording** assignments or quizzes must be done without background noises (i.e. other people talking, TV, music, etc.) for they will have a negative impact on our grade. If your recording indicates that someone helped you with an assignment or contains any vulgar language and/or you did not follow "netiquette", you will receive a grade of zero and disciplinary actions will be initiated for academic dishonesty and/or misconduct on your part.

<u>Culture (Discussion Boards)</u>: (15%) There are 3 discussion board assignments for the semester. You will use BB to access and complete these assignments. To access these assignments, please go to Blackboard's Course Content, click on the Week Folder for which the assignment is due or click the Discussion Board folder. See BB "Schedule & Deadlines" or "MY GRADES" widget for due dates and rubrics. No late assignments will be accepted. See Make-Up Policy.

<u>Written Exams</u>: (30%) There will be 4 Written (Chapter) Exams. You must have access to MSL to complete them. The exams will focus primarily on the content of the chapter; however, since language learning is cumulative (similar to math classes), they are comprehensive (including materials from previous chapters which you are responsible for retaining and reviewing) and mandatory and will test reading, writing, culture, listening skills and your ability to use grammar and vocabulary in communicative situations. Each exam is timed (you have one hour). The lowest exam grade will be dropped. See BB "Schedules & Deadlines" or "My Grades" widgets for exam dates. A review/study guide will be provided on BB "Course Content" (see BB Announcements for when they become available.) See Make-Up Policy.

<u>Oral Exams</u>: (30%) There will be 2 oral exams (one Midterm and one Final). There are 2 parts to each oral exam. See BB for details and specific instructions (will be posted in Course Content); for due dates and rubrics, see "Schedule & Deadlines" or "My Grades" widget. See make-up policy.

- 1. <u>Written scripts</u> are required and graded, and must be typed using <u>14pt font</u>, <u>double spaced</u>, with proper grammar (accents marks, question and exclamation points) and <u>saved as .docx or .pdf files only</u>, and will be turned in and will be graded before your Oral Exams' submissions. You will then make corrections (if needed), practice, memorize, and record yourself presenting the oral exams.
- 2. <u>Oral Exams Presentations</u> are asynchronous video recordings of yourself presenting the required topic. You must save your recordings as a video file (.mov and or .mp4 files). <u>Do not use .mkv</u> (Chrome books) or Google docs. Specific instructions will be provided in BB Course Content.
