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## I. GENERAL COURSE INFORMATION:

A. <u>COURSE DESCRIPTION</u>: ENGL 2332. (3:3:0) This course is a study of selected literary masterpieces written through the Renaissance. Prerequisites: ENGL 1301 & 1302

B. GOAL OF THE COURSE: English 2332 introduces students to some of the great works of literature, from the Ancient World through the Renaissance, which helped to shape modern literature, language and culture. The course includes a general historical background, as well as the principles of literary criticism appropriate to the literature

# II. SPECIFIC COURSE/INSTRUCTOR REQUIREMENTS:

A. <u>TEXTS:</u> The Norton Anthology of Western Literature 9<sup>th</sup> edition. Volume 1 Shakespeare, William. The Tragedy of Macbeth. Scantrons (5) Datalink 1200 (blue, 50 questions)

- B. <u>COURSE ATTENDANCE</u>: Due to the steps being taken to minimize the effects of the pandemic, the SPC attendance policy is in flux. For this course, an emphasis will be placed on turning in assignments, rather than physical in-person attendance. Basically, students who fail to submit assignments will be dropped from the course once a 'D' is no longer feasible.
- C. <u>ACADEMIC INTEGRITY</u>: The guidelines for academic integrity set forth in the current South Plains College catalog will be followed, but perhaps one specific category should be addressed here: plagiarism and cheating. According to the SPC catalog, "Complete honesty is required of the student in the presentation of any and all phases of course work. This applies to quizzes of whatever length as well as to final examinations, to daily reports and to term papers." Failure to comply with this policy will result in a '0' (no credit) for the assignment and can result in an "F" for the course if circumstances warrant.

Except in extreme cases, disciplinary action in cases of cheating or plagiarism will be handled by and at the discretion of the instructor and, if necessary, in consultation with the department chairperson. Depending on the nature and the severity of the problem, individual instructors may assign penalties from zero for the assignment to an "F" in the course. Extreme cases may result in disciplinary action up to and including expulsion from South Plains College.
