Student Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course and receiving a passing grade, the student will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate and apply knowledge of properties of functions.
- 2. Recognize and apply algebraic and transcendental functions and solve related equations.
- 3. Apply graphing techniques to algebraic and transcendental functions.
- 4. Compute the values of trigonometric functions for key angles in all quadrants of the unit circle measured in both degrees and radians.
- 5. Prove trigonometric identities.
- 6. Solve right and oblique triangles.

Attendance Policy: Attendance and effort are the most important activities for success in this course. Records of your attendance are maintained throughout the semester. Five (5) absences, *for any reason*, are allotted to the student for the semester. Tardies count as one-half (1/2) of an absence. SPC TexBook Syllabus Statement

TexBook Program: This course is not in the SPC TexBook program, but you do not need to purchase a textbook or access code for this course. Springlake-Earth ISD owns the textbooks, and students check them out from the textbook room.

- What is TexBook? The required textbook/digital content for some courses is available to you in Blackboard from the first day of class. The fee for the textbook/digital content is the lowest price available from the publisher and bookstore and is <u>included</u> in your tuition/fee payment.
